Furthermore, we have developed a five-year strategic plan that will guide our comprehensive growth in a systematic manner in the future.

GBCD serves as a vital resource organization for individuals with disabilities, offering a wide range of assessments, therapies, training programmes, counseling, and guidance under one roof for children and adults alike. In addition, we provide necessary medications for children and individuals living with epilepsy and mental illnesses.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our funders, donors, well-wishers for their continuous support. I would also like to thank honourable GB members, and staffs for their support and active participation in helping me to reach out our goals. Looking ahead, we aspire to expand our working areas beyond our district. Together, we will continue working towards empowerment & inclusion of persons with disabilities.

identification of disability at birth or within the critical age and then the earliest, if there is any problem. Our "Early Intervention Programme" caters to children upto 6 years old with developmental delays. We usually organize childhood disability screening camp at ICDS centres & sub-health generally come with their children at those centers

Early Intervention is screening, if there is any problem, we refer them to our main center for clinical assessment like: starting intervention at Audiological, Mobility, Eye Check up& Psychological assessment. After confirmation of disability, Counselling & guidance programme is being started with the parents through home based intervention. Thus we use an integrated approach centres. Parents that empowers the parents to enable them to support their children for screening. After appropriately and of course adequately for their development. Further we try to build up a sustainable ecosystem for the Children with Disabilities by involving not only the families but also the Health Workers, ICDS Workers, and Community People at large.

Our Early Intervention programme includes need based rehabilitation services like: Counseling & Guidance to Parents, Home Based Support, Comprehensive Therapy, Providing & uses of Assistive & Adaptive

Device, Medical & Surgical Intervention and linkage with Social Security Schemes.

Presently 176 CwDs including children with Cerebral Palsy, Intellectual Disability, Hearing Impaired, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Locomotor and Multiple Disabilities are under our Early Intervention Programme.



EQUIPPED CLINICAL FACILITIES UNDER ONE ROOF



Rural poor and marginalized urban community always think that the city centered clinical facilities are costly and not for poor. In reality, accessing these clinical therapeutic services is luxury for them as they need to travel a long distance independently to reach those centres and need to sacrifice at least a day – wage for this purpose.

GBCD observed this need and arranged all this clinical facilities like: Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy, Eye Check up, Audiological and Psychological assessment and Treatment & Medicine for Neuro- Psychiatric problems, run by qualified Doctor & Therapists, at affordable cost, under one roof.

COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION (CBR) APPROACH



We are working through CBR approach, i.e. identification, management and rehabilitation of CwDs & PwDs by using the local resources and involving the community to the maximum extant. Our objective is to, in one hand, making the community responsible to address the disability issues and on the other hand making the children and persons with disabilities self reliant and the productive member of the society and thus we as an organization, play the role of a catalyst.

Our journey starts from identification and leads to empowerment and the route map includes early intervention, home based support, skill transfer to the parents, inclusive education, life skill training, awareness on rights-entitlements & responsibilities as a

citizen and economic placement for CwDs & PwDs and so on.

Our approach puts the child with a disability at the center. We intensively involve the family and empower them by transferring our skills and by providing updated information on disability issues: Rights & Entitlements for them to ensure quality support for the child at home as well as enabling them to advocate for their children. Further we focus on the community by making them aware of the potential of this weaker section to ensure equal opportunities and full participation of the CwDs & PwDs within the community without any discrimination.

Thus through this approach we ensure a disability friendly, inclusive & welcoming environment for the people with disabilities within the society.








Marginalized rural poor are always engaged in earning two meals a day. Neither they recognize the need, nor they can afford the appropriate Aids, Appliances and Assistive Devices for the training and management of their children with disabilities. Costly aids & appliances like: Hearing Aids, Wheel Chair, Tri-Cycle, Modified Chair, Corner seat, Walker, Prosthesis & Orthosis, Artificial Limb etc. are always beyond their reach.


GBCD mobilize local funds from philanthropic persons to arrange these required aids from the market and sometimes the experienced workers used to prepare certain aids like Modified Chair, Corner seat, Walker, Splint, Gaiter, Ear mould etc. We also prepare certain daily life aids like Toilet Seat, Parallel Bar and Walker etc. using the locally available materials like bamboo, wood and cane etc.

Thus through this approach we ensure a disability friendly, inclusive & welcoming environment for the people with disabilities within the society.









INCLUSIVE EDUCATION & DISABILITY FRIENDLY **MATERIAL DEVELOPMENT UNIT**

Inclusion is the right to belong to the mainstream." We believe in Inclusion, thus all our identified CwDs / PwDs are enrolled in ICDS or in local govt. primary schools, high schools & colleges as per their age. We also work on creating disability friendly inclusive environment in schools by providing disability friendly TLMs, Adapted Lessons, Teaching Demonstrations and adaptive training to the teachers and peers. Further we have developed a dedicated Material Development unit (TLM). There we are preparing Adapted booklets, Concept Charts, Training materials etc. In 2023, 09 students with disabilities have passed Madhyamik (Secondary) exam and 06 students with disabilities have passed Uchha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) exam.










SKILL TRAINING & PLACEMENT

Education has a little value unless and until followed by gainful employment. Thus we provide Vocational and life skill training that includes living with self & others, critical thinking & decision making and workplace behavior along with computer literacy training. We conduct resource mapping to identify employment opportunities around our near-by locality. Then we sensitize employers to ensure economic placement of PwDs.

At present 54 PwDs are in Vocational Training on Computer literacy programme.117 PwDs are in gainful employment in approximately 35 factories / workplaces, earning roughly 12000 – 15000 per month.











As a community based organization the need & demand of the community is our utmost priority. We have seen that rural marginalised people at our intervention areas cannot access to sophisticated eye care facilities, even they are not so aware about cataract which leads to blindness if untreated. Thus we have started comprehensive eye care facilities for them through community level eye check-up camps. People are availing services like Eye Check-up, Cataract Surgery, and Power Spectacles etc. for free. In this year 2137 people have benefited from Eye care Initiatives among them 451 people have successfully completed cataract surgery while 568 people have received spectacle for free.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

- 09 students with disability have passed Madhyamik (Secondary Exam) in 2023.
- 06 students with disability have passed Uchha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary Exam) in 2023.
- ♦ 42 no of PwDs were placed in Gainful Employment
- 260 no of Aids & Appliances to CwDs & PwDs in 2023-24
- 479 Children / Person with Disability has been linked with Govt. Schemes
- We have developed paperless internal M & E and Reporting system.
- We have developed our five year Strategy & Plan for 2024-2028.
- We have completed a study on the factors that influences the development of children with cerebral palsy in economically weaker families of rural areas under our intervention. We have shared this report with our stakeholders
- We have inaugurated and have started activities in our own new building at Block level Resource Centre of Dhaniakhali block. It is to be noticed that we have mobilized community resources to set up this building within a span of one year.
- We have purchased an Oto-Acoustic Emission (OAE) Machine, for at birth hearing screening to strengthen our Audiology unit. This device will be used for early identification of deafness in new born babies.
- We, in association with Rotary Eye Hospital, Hooghly & VRX, Kolkata, have conducted Prevention of blindness Initiatives. Total 2137 people have undergone Eye Check up procedure, 568 people received power spectacle for free and 451 people have successfully completed comprehensive cataract surgery procedure for free of cost.
- Deaf Child Worldwide (DCW) has conferred us with a 'certificate of gratitude' for being development partner for 16 years.
- We have strengthened our TLM Development unit with updated software & machinery and develop adapted Booklet, Concept Chart, Video TLMs for our Deaf Students.

Strategic Goal of the year (2024-25)



- Children and person of all categories of disabilities of Pandua, Polba-Dadpur, Balagarh & Dhaniakhali four Blocks of the district will be under the intervention of the organization
- At Birth Screening of disabilities and Early Intervention
- Inclusive Education and disability friendly environment in all educational institutions of our intervention area.
- Economic Placement / Livelihood programme for persons with disabilities.
- Mental Health Programme and Mobile Clinic for Identification, Assessment & Treatment (including distribution of Medicine) for children and Persons with Mental Illness and Neurological Disorders including epilepsy among the target population
- Prevention of blindness Programme.
- Expansion of our focus from HH, MH, CP, ASD to Multiple Disability Including Deaf-Blind among the target population
- Technology & Digitalization for ensuring transparency (that include Paperless Reporting system along with digitized M&E system) inside and outside the organisation.
- Mobilization of local resources through various ways to ensure the participation of the local community, making them responsible too and on the other hand making the organization accountable to the community become the major elegance of the organization.
- Supporting small NGOs on programme planning, capacity building of staffs & technical assistance on disability management.
- Programme on Children with Cleft-palate & Cleft-Lip.

Fulmoni Soren, a six year old tribal girl from Bainchi village of Hooghly district has Cerebral Palsy with spasticity. She lives with her parents who are daily wage earner associated in agricultural sector.

GBCD has identified her through an ICDS worker in 2019. Then she had no neck control and spent her days lying at bed. She uses to drool a lot.

At first GBCD has enrolled her into early intervention programme where we counselled and guided her parents on her daily care and management along with Physiotherapy support. After few days GBCD arrange a corner sit (a special aids for neck controlling) for her and started Home based support. During Home visit we are supporting her with occupational activities for her physical development of gripping, sitting, standing and walking etc. Further we

have trained her on ADL activities of self-help bathing, eating, toileting etc. Her mother is very much motivated, she is following our guidance, regularly attend our training, meeting & short stay camps and practice those work at home on regular basis. In order to ensure her mobility we have prepared a bamboo made parallel bar at her home and a toilet seat for toileting using available local resources.

Presently she is able to walk independently although mobility correction training (GAIT) is going on. Her drooling is now controlled. She is able to perform self-help brushing, eating, bathing, toileting etc. She is now admitted in pre-primary class at Sodpara Primary School and attends school regularly. Further we have linked her to various govt. facilities like Disability Card & Certificate, Bank Account, Manobik Pension etc.





RIPON BAG

Ripon Bag is a 5 year old little boy from Bhastara village of Dhaniakhali block. He has hearing Impairment. His mother told that he has fallen down from a height at a very early age and thus his ears are seriously injured on that accident. Therefore his deafness was confirmed by an ENT specialist when he was 2 years old.

GBCD has identified him in 2021 at the age of 3. He was very jolly in nature child but did not utter anything. Although then he had hearing aids but it was no use as those hearing aids were not appropriate for him.

GBCD has immediately started intervening with him through Early Identification programme where we have counseled her parents about the necessity of appropriate hearing aid for his development. Later, we have raised fund and contribute a major amount for his hearing aid and started speech therapy support. Beside, GBCD conduct weekly once Home visit for him. During Home visit our CBRWs provide educational support through School readiness programme along with speech training observing conversation methodology. GBCD also trained his parent on Deaf communication and teaching methodology along with various usages of TLMs. Seeing his development, his parents has arranged another hearing aid for him.

Presently he can communicate his needs with his family members through speech. He is now able to understand and perform his parents' spoken orders. Now he reads in pre-primary and goes to school every day with his mother and plays with his peers. His Parent wishes that Ripon will be well educated in future. Her mother says, "If we did not come to GBCD, my child would have not been able to speak. Hearing aid alone is of no use unless and until accompanied with stimulating speech-language enriched environment. CBRWs (Dada, as his mother calls) informed us about small things which help immensely for the development of Ripon".
