60 community-level awareness programs have been organized.




GBCD has started intervening at Purbastali II block of East Burdwan district

Amaresh Malik (MI)

Twenty Seven year old Amaresh Malik from Sikhira village of Pandua Block is suffering from Mental Illness. His father is suffering from age related disease and his mother doing domestic work at neighboring households for earning. Her mother recalls that there is no sign of insanity in him till he was in Class XII. He used to attend school on regular basis and in order to provide financial support to his family, he started offering tuition to the children of primary level.

But one day during tuition he suddenly felt sick which was later identified as severe neurological disorder that leads to lack in confidence and mental illness. The same boy who was courteous to everyone developed abnormal behavior like beating, biting, spitting and using of slangs to everyone. This catastrophic incident leads his family to utter despair. Amaresh has to be in chained to control him and maintain safety of other family members. Despite the parents' efforts to arrange treatment for their child, the financial burden of medical expenses has become overwhelming. His mother stated that they sold out all their belonging i.e- Cattle, metal pot and yet the funds remain insufficient for Medicine expenses. Consequently, she has started begging for assistance.

In 2023, GBCD identified him through one of our beneficiary parents who has taken his mother to us. From then on GBCD was offering Treatment & Medicine support along with periodical counseling by clinical psychologist to them. In addition of medical support GBCD has arranged Ration, New Cloths, Winter Cloths etc. to them.

As a result of consistent medical intervention, Amaresh has successfully regained his normal lifestyle. Now he started business of fish along with his mother. And started behave like a responsible member of the family by looking after the household activities. Presently, his parents aspire to see Amaresh employed, thus enabling him to earn a livelihood.
