Om Roy

Om Roy, a five-year old cerebral palsy child of Balagarh block was identified at the age of 2 years. His Parents are daily wage earner. During identification we found him lying on the floor without neck control and with severe epilepsy. Parents were not aware of disability issues instead believe on various superstitions. Within the family, there was a lack of acceptance of his disability, with only his mother taking responsibility for his care, while others did not provide any support.

Upon Identification we have started intervention with counseling and guidance to the parents. Then general and mobility assessment of the child has completed we have also developed an Individual Rehabilitation Plan (IRP) for him. Started physiotherapy at clinic and home based Occupational Therapy by CBRW, medication for epilepsy and arrangement of corner seat (as sitting assistive device) as advised by the physiotherapist. We have arranged ICDS Awareness programme to ensure accessible education as well as social inclusion.

Now Om is sitting independently and standing with support, his epilepsy is almost under control. His skills in Activities of Daily Living (ADL) are also improving; he can eat dry foods with some assistance. He attends ICDS Centre regularly. His mother use to take him for learning as well as social inclusion. He has been linked with govt. facilities like UDID card & MANOBK Pension. Seeing his progress, his family members are now extremely happy and motivated. They are filled with hope for his future and have become more enthusiastic about supporting his development.
